Privacy Act Statement

Guidelines and Procedures

Regarding Use of Metal Detectors on TVA Lands

Description: Metal detecting as a recreational activity is allowed on certain TVA fee-owned lands. Metal detectors may not be used on any prehistoric or historic archaeological site, or at any human burial location. These sites and their contents are protected by both state and federal laws.

Where Applied: These guidelines and procedures are applicable on all TVA fee-owned property.

Enforcement Emphasis: TVA Police will ensure adherence to these guidelines and other federal and state laws. Violation of these guidelines and procedures may result in prosecution and/or the loss of the privilege to use metal detectors on TVA property and/or the forfeiture of the metal detector. Users are expected to work cooperatively with the TVA Police and report any violations.

Rationale: TVA recognizes that there are legitimate, recreational uses of metal detectors that should be allowed on designated TVA lands when they do not infringe on specific TVA stewardship responsibility or operation of TVA facilities. The use of metal detectors within the "Guidelines and Procedures" shall not result in the violation of any state or federal law including the Archaeological Resources Protection Act of 1979 nor in violation of other TVA policies and procedures.

Guidelines

Metal detectors may be used on TVA property in the following locations:

- Within formal swimming areas
- Within the designated boundaries of TVA campgrounds
(Campsite must be unoccupied)
- Immediately adjacent to public launching ramps *(within 100 feet)*
- Parking areas associated with any of the above

Procedures

Each user must obtain a free Metal Detecting Permit from their local TVA Police office before using a metal detector on TVA lands. Users can contact their local TVA Police office by telephone or by a personal visit.

Extracting and removal of objects located with a metal detecting device shall be:

- Conducted only with a hand implement, e.g., hand trowel
- Limited to a depth of six (6) inches below the surface and a diameter of six (6) inches
- Refilled and the ground surface returned to its original condition as much as possible
- Limited in campgrounds, or other designated areas covered by grass, from April 15 to October 1
- Any trash or debris generated by activities will be removed from TVA property or placed in a trash receptacle
- Conducted only within times, dates, and locations specified on the metal detecting permit
